Code of Ethics



Four Wheel Drive Australia Code Of Ethics

ST4WDC is affiliated with Four Wheel Drive Australia and we promote responsible four wheel driving. We should all observe and support this Code of Ethics. Remember, image is difficult to change.

- Obey the laws and regulations for Recreational Vehicles that apply to public lands.
- Respect the cultural, heritage and environmental values of public/private land, by obeying restrictions that may apply.
- Respect our flora and fauna. Stop and look, but never disturb.
- Keep to formed vehicle tracks.
- Keep the environment clean. Carry your own, and any other, rubbish out.
- Keep your vehicle mechanically sound and clean to reduce the environmental impact.
- Adopt minimal impact camping and driving practices.
- Seek permission before driving on private land. Do not disturb livestock or watering points, leave gates as found.
- Take adequate water, food, fuel, basic spares and a first aid kit on trips. In remote areas travel with another vehicle and have Royal Flying Doctor Service, or equivalent emergency contact by radio or satellite.
- Plan ahead and lodge trip details with a responsible person.
- Enjoy your recreation and respect the rights of others.
- Support four-wheel drive touring as a legitimate family activity.
- Consider joining an affiliated four-wheel drive Club.

This Code supports the National Recreational Four Wheel Drive Vehicle Policy.

We recognise that this may upset some members, but hopefully given the levels of vaccination in the ACT and NSW there won't be that many members who will be affected. You may be asked your Covid vaccination status, and asked for proof, but health information, including your vaccination status, will not be permanently recorded. The alternative is that trip leaders simply may not run any trips.

What this means is you will see the following words (or similar) on a number of upcoming trips/events: *Due to the concerns of the Event Organiser, as a volunteer, they are unwilling to risk their health and those of other event participants by being in close proximity to unvaccinated participants. The Event Organiser is therefore unable to offer a position on this event to anyone who has not been double vaccinated.*

As always, it is a balance between participation and the health, safety and well-being of our members, and we try and work on the best and latest information and health advice available. If you have any concerns, I am happy to discuss this decision with you.

I can hear someone calling "Where are you? Let's go!" (since I left them in the car while I raced back in to write this), so I better go. I will finish this short note ("yippee" I hear you say) with all the normal platitudes required at this time of year; smelly fish-mess and a sweaty pooh bear. Hope you and your family have a safe and wonderful Christmas, see you all next year for more adventures. And remember, as Melanie White said (no, I don't know who she is); "A Christmas miracle is when your family doesn't get into a single argument all day."

Trip Grading

For trips in the Club's calendar a grading system of levels 1 to 6 is used to assist members in deciding which trips they would most enjoy and which grade suits the driver's level of skill, vehicle and experience. This system of grading is a guide only. The grade assigned to a trip may change due to weather conditions, and the trip leader should be consulted in such circumstances. The trip leader has the right to deny a request from a driver who is considered not to have the necessary level of skill in four wheel driving, or whose vehicle is deemed inadequate.

Trip Report - Talooge Visit



A small group made an opportunistic mid week visit to Talooge on Wednesday 17th November to check on the property and carry out minor maintenance of the facilities.

Following heavy rainfall in the area it was no surprise to find the creek and river levels up and flowing well.

It was a glorious sunny day with the sun out in full force and the last effects of a patchy Springtime evident in the greenery.

Strike a Light Fire Trail was in good condition and ARB Crossing across Strike a Light River was high but passable.



On entering Home Paddock I was surprised to find that the grass was not as high as expected, probably due to the mowing efforts of the last muster crew, resident kangaroos, wombats, and occasional feral goat.

The facilities looked to be in good order with no evidence of damage or interference apart from a few displaced

chairs and plastic barrels blown around in the wind.

After checking the buildings and facilities we noticed that the water level in the top water tank was low without apparent reason.

After checking the various valves and levels it appeared that the tank had simply run down through normal use and hadn't been pumped full for a while so the transfer pump was run to move water from the capture tank beside the building.



You may or may not know that during a recent muster a group cleared a new track up the hill behind the machinery shed, and dubbed it Mobile Hill due to the greatly improved mobile phone reception available at the top.

I had since started to carve a seat out of a fallen log intended as a perch for the top of Mobile Hill but unfortunately there really wasn't enough time for any progress on it during this visit. Perhaps I'll get a chance to finish it at the next muster.



A cursory check of a few of the tracks used for basic training found a few fallen trees which were cleared ready for the next tree to fall or the next training course to occur, whichever comes first.

A nice meat pie was procured from the travel oven for lunch and the group made our way out via Strike a Light Fire Trail and home again via the Bredbo Pub.

NPWS has a new online volunteer management system called VIP. Please follow the instruction below to register in the system. The process should take 5-10 minutes.


1. Go to this link: <https://4wdnow.com/pages/volunteer-sign-up-with-national-parks>
2. Hit the YELLOW "FILL IN APPLICATION" Button on the right of the screen. (red circle in screen shot below)



3. Create an account by filling in the form "I am new to MyImpactPage.com" (See this area in red rectangle to right). Use your EMAIL as your username. Click yellow SAVE AND CONTINUE button when you are finished.



4. Fill in the CONTACT INFORMATION form to the best of your abilities. The fields with FLAGS are required. Then Press the yellow SAVE AND CONTINUE button at the bottom of the page (red arrow in photo to right - you might need to scroll down to see it).



5. Another screen will pop up with multiple questions. Fill in the questions. Ones with FLAGS are required. Put N/A if it is required but you have no answer. Scroll down and continue to answer questions. After you have filled in the questions to the best of your ability, you will find the "SUBMIT APPLICATION" yellow button at the bottom of the page. Press this button and an APPLICATION COMPLETE confirmation screen will appear.




